Dear Undergraduate, Graduate and Post-doc:

GLCACS is a local chapter of Chinese American Chemical Society (CACS) in the Great Lakes region, including Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota, Iowa, and Ohio. CACS is a Chinese-American professional organization affiliated with both the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) and the American Chemical Society (ACS). Since its founding, GLCACS has played an active role in promoting professional development and networking for GLCACS members and non-members alike.

Each year, GLCACS invites students, postdoctoral fellows, and researchers from all regional universities to participate in a presentation contest and awards session during the Annual Meeting. This year, the context will take the form of **5-minute Blitz Talks**. This is different from previous years and we believe it will make the contest more exciting and effective. Make sure you read the guideline attached. Regardless of academic disciplines and ethnic origins, all undergraduate, graduate students and postdoctoral fellows are encouraged to participate. **Act quick though: we can take only the first 24 participants!**

Blitz Presentations will be evaluated according to both the technical merits and presentation effectiveness by all conference attendees. A total of \$600 cash will be awarded to those outstanding presenters through votes. The format of this year's awards would be:

- One First Place – \$150
- Two Second Places – \$100 each
- Three Third Places – \$50 each
- Five Honorable Mentions – \$20 each

This year, the 18th GLCACS annual meeting will be held at Abbott Laboratories, 200 Abbott Park Rd. Abbott Park, IL on May 17th, 2014. We welcome presentations from different research fields: Chemistry, Biochemistry, Biophysics, Bioengineering, Biotechnology, Chemical Engineering, Material Sciences, Environmental Science and other interdisciplinary areas. Blitz Talk Presentation Requirement

1. Presentation slide file should be in **PowerPoint or PDF format**.
2. This is a **Blitz Talk** contest! Each presenter has **5 minutes only**!
3. You will be disqualified for the competition award if exceeding the 5-minute limit.
4. The presenting will be in alphabetical order. The exact information will be available at the registration desk on May 17, 2014.
5. GLCACS will provide a Projector and Laptop. Please send your presentation slide file (.ppt or .pptx or .PDF file) *via*. email to glcacsposter@gmail.com by **10:00 AM, May 16th, 2014**.

Guidelines and Suggestions

- **Prepare 4-6 slides.** Only include key points. Remember, you'll disqualify yourself if exceeding the 5-minute limit!
- **Don't give your presentation software center stage.** Never forget: *You are the presenter.* Your message should be the focus. Not your slides. Not your props.
- **Create a logical flow to your presentation.** Better yet, tell a story. It should have an introduction, body and conclusion.
- **Make your presentation readable.** "If people can't read my slides from the back of the room, my type is too small."
 - ✓ *Avoid paragraphs or long blocks of text*
 - ✓ *Avoid detailed reports*
- **Remember, less is more.** You may need some slide transitions to guide the eye, but fancy slide transitions and fly-ins get old quickly.
